



How do we get rewards for recycling ink cartridges? Qualifying purchases include any product or service purchase made in store or online. All brands of ink qualify for recycling rewards. This helps with the rising cost of supplies for the church. There is a basket on a shelf in the Narthex between the Men's & Ladies' Restrooms for your cartridges.

VCAM operates Monday – Friday, 9 a.m. – noon, for the homeless population & qualifying residents of Victoria County. Regular (monthly) clients can come on a once-a-month basis, while the homeless can come on a daily basis. In addition to pre-packaged groceries for monthly clients, VCAM also has a free clothing store "Family Closet", stocked w/clothes strictly from donations. Donations are accepted Mon. – Fri., 7:30 a.m. – 1 p.m. Due to limited space, donations are limited to *clothing only*.

As we approach Easter, churches, businesses, civic organizations & individuals are encouraged to start a food drive to benefit our pantry & of course, the clients in need.

Staple inventory items currently in dire need in the pantry:

Rice (1 or 2 lbs. bags – uncooked), cereals (box or bag), pastas, tomato sauce, canned veggies or fruits.

The homeless population served at VCAM also increased. Homeless needs for perishable foods are not always the most cost-effective, so donations in this area to help meet the increased need are greatly appreciated. Donations of small hygiene kits are also encouraged:

Small Canned Meats & other proteins, peanut butter or cheese crackers, breakfast/granola bars, fruit/jello cups.

Of course, the most spiritual & practical way to give is in the form of monetary donations:





In the above chart, you can see our expenses and offerings. Our expenses totaled \$17,186.75; our offerings and other income totaled \$17741.18 resulting in a budgeted "gain" of \$554.43. If you were to go back and look at these numbers for the last 8 months, you would notice the trend that our expenses were greater than offerings and income. In large part, this is due to the incredible increase in our property and liability insurance early in 2024. We share this with you so you are aware of how this is continuing to impact our overall ministry. Even as we continue to thank God for the many blessings He gives to Zion, including those of the financial offerings of His people, the Church Council and Church Office are being as mindful as possible about the stewardship of the church budget.

CHRISTIAN SYMBOL



PALM BRANCH — When Jesus entered Jerusalem days before his death, crowds welcomed him by waving palm branches, common symbols of victory and rejoicing. Churches still use them to remember that occasion, knowing that Jesus' crucifixion was the ultimate triumph over sin and

death. As early as Leviticus 23:40, God commanded Israel to use palms in a festival of rejoicing. In Revelation 7:9-10, Christian martyrs carry palm branches as they praise the Lamb before God's throne.



EASTER INSIGHTS

Did you know the word *Easter* never appears in the Bible? It may be a variant of the name Eostre, a pagan fertility goddess who symbolized rebirth and spring. Eostre stems from the Proto-Germanic word for dawn, which Christians connect to Jesus' victory over darkness.

The ancient tradition of Easter baskets also has ties to Eostre, whose symbol was a rabbit. Christians likely adapted the practice of bringing eggs and seeds as an offering to Eostre. Some Orthodox Christians continue a tradition of having a priest bless baskets of Easter food on Holy Saturday. Items usually hold special symbolism, such as Paska bread, cured meats, colored eggs, salt, horseradish and lamb-shaped butter.

THE BLESSING OF FELLOWSHIP



Between the death of Christ and the Last Day it is only by gracious anticipation of the last things that Christians are privileged to live in invisible fellowship with other Christians. It is by the grace

of God that a congregation is permitted to gather visibly in this world to share God's Word and sacrament. Not all Christians receive this blessing. The imprisoned, the sick, the scattered lonely, the proclaimers of the Gospel in heathen lands stand alone. They know that visible fellowship is a blessing.
